### FIND YOUR CALLING - AND GO "ALL IN"

We had a great speaker this past week by the name of "Coach" Bryan Haley. Mr. Haley did a presentation he has adapted from a book called "Uncover Your Calling: Work Reimagined" by Richard J. Leider & David A. Shapiro. Bryan uses this work to present to high-school age students wherever he gets invited.

Bryan's "calling" is to encourage students to find their calling. He does this by engaging students in an interactive exercise. He starts out by showing basic facts about the importance of a post-high school education.

The students the sort through a list of attributes or skillss, and indentify those they would use to describe themselves. These attributes are from categories, such as:

- Realistic
- Social
- Structured
- Artistic
- Enterprising
- Investigative

They further narrow this to the top five, the the top one calling, their single most natural preference. Now they are positioned to identify several careers that fit with this natural calling. This is such a calling for Byan he conducts these progrms free of charge.

Things Bryan wants students to remember about their calling? First, calling comes from a caller. The calling will keep calling. Having a calling is very personal, and calling is connecting.






