They gathered chocolate bars, other food products, books & purchased rag dolls, made toys and by the beginning of December they had four large bags of presents to give to the people. The soldiers were leaving for home on December 6 so before they left they went to the local orphanage.

One soldier had a white beard and red cap as it just happens that December 6 is the day that Christmas is celebrated in Holland. The church bells were ringing and everyone was celebrating. The Priest welcomed the soldiers and was thrilled that Santa Clause was there.

The last chocolate bar went to a five year old. He thanked Santa Clause and his helpers.

Then he turned to the Priest and said:

**"We told you he would come"**

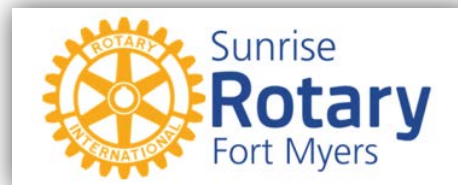
